In September we had a total of 61 people visit the Kahnawà:ke Welcome Center; Our visitors come from all over the world however the majority of people come from across Canada with a total of 32.

Kahnawà:ke Tourism organized 9 private group tours with a total of 189 participants. Visitors came from United States, Toronto, Quebec City, and Montreal. A total of 24 visitors joined the Religious Patrimony days where they participated in a guided visit of the Saint Francis Xavier Mission. Five educational tours were held where students and teachers toured the community, visited the Language and Cultural Center, dined at a local restaurant & shopped at local boutiques as well as enjoyed fresh Strawberry juice from "The Store".

One group of seniors from Holy Land Travel came to visit Saint Francis Xavier Mission to learn about Saint Kateri Tekakwitha. Additionally, we hosted a group from Farm Credit Canada who wanted to learn the history of our community and explore potential partnerships in agricultural development.
