MAPLE FEST SUGAR SHACK BRUNCH RECAP

On Sunday, March 23rd, 2025, we hosted a celebration of local heritage as the 9th Annual Maple Fest transformed the grounds into a vibrant showcase of maple culture at the Knights of Columbus. With an impressive turnout of over 500 attendees, the event buzzed with excitement, community spirit, and the irresistible aroma of sweet maple treats.

The day started with a delightful Sugar Shack brunch by The Rail, praised attendees. by with partnership Caisse Populaire, the event celebrated traditional maple offerings and featured over 20 vendors showcasing handmade goods, intricate beadwork, baked treats, and flavorful popcorn, each item reflecting the region's creativity and commitment to quality.





Adding to the festivities were special attractions that delighted all ages. Local favorite Hannah Deer charmed visitors with enchanting horse and buggy rides, while the dynamic duo, Mitchell and Jada Horne, captivated the crowd by serving up delectable maple taffy on a stick. History came alive as Arihhón:ni David led a fascinating storytelling session, recounting the rich legacy of maple syrup production that has been a cornerstone of our community for generations.

The vibrant competitive spirit of Maple Fest shone brightly during the "Best Maple Syrup in Town" contest. The judges were thoroughly impressed by the flavors, ultimately awarding Kyle Zacharie the top prize. Sweet Beavers and Kaienthokwen followed closely as the runner-up contenders in this close competition. A survey was conducted, and Samantha Lahache emerged as the fortunate winner of a \$50 Maple Goods gift bag graciously sponsored by Kaienthokwen!

This year's Maple Fest was not only a celebration of a beloved tradition but also a vibrant gathering that brought the community together to appreciate local flavors, artistic expressions, and enduring cultural heritage. We are very proud to highlight that so many in Kahnawà:ke are tapping trees in their yards or in the forests with their families and the

positive connections and teachings that it brings. Putting in the work to make syrup makes one appreciate the amount of sugar water that makes syrup. Not only is syrup a sweet treat for us, maple syrup contains many minerals that are not found in white sugar, the maple water also serves as a detoxifier for the liver! 




